KARL DEUTSCH AWARD



The purpose of the Karl Deutsch Award is to honour a prominent scholar engaged in the **cross-disciplinary research** of which Karl Deutsch was a master, with a particular focus on recognizing outstanding scholarship in the field of global politics. The recipient presents the Karl Deutsch lecture at the IPSA World Congress of Political Science. The Karl Deutsch Lectures are published in the International Political Science Review. The award is made on the recommendation of the IPSA Committee on

Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA). It is supported by the Karl Deutsch fund.

Karl Wolfgang Deutsch (1912-1992)

Born in Prague, Karl Deutsch immigrated to the US in the late '30s. He taught at the MIT, Yale, and Harvard. He assumed the role of President of IPSA from 1976-79. He was also President of the American Political Science Association and director of the International Institute of Comparative Social Research at the Science Center in Berlin. He passed away in November 1992.

Prize: US\$1,000 (1 recipient)

The prize includes US\$1,000, economy airfare and registration fee for the upcoming Congress. The award winner presents a lecture at the 2020 IPSA World Congress of Political Science. Funding: Karl Deutsch Fund.

Note: The prize is contingent upon attendance and lecture presentation at the 2020 World Congress.



JUAN LINZ PRIZE



The purpose of the Juan Linz Prize is to honour a prominent scholar engaged in the **Decentralization**, **Multinational and Multiethnic Integration and Federalism Comparative Research** of which Juan Linz was a master, with a particular focus on recognizing outstanding scholarship in the field of (comparative) political institutions. The recipient presents the Juan Linz lecture at the IPSA World Congress of Political Science. The award is made on the recommendation of the IPSA Committee on Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA). From 2012 to 2108, the award was supported by the Juan Linz fund which was created and sponsored by the EUSKOBAROMETRO observatory

of the University of the Basque Country.

Nomination deadline: 1 November 2019

Prize: US\$ 1,000 and travel expenses (1 recipient)

The prize includes US\$1,000, travel expenses up to US\$2,000 and registration fee for the upcoming Congress. The award winner presents a lecture at the 2020 IPSA World Congress of Political Science. Funding: IPSA

Note: The prize is contingent upon attendance and lecture presentation at the 2020 World Congress.

PRIZE OF THE FOUNDATION MATTEI DOGAN AWARDED BY THE INTERNATIONAL POLITICAL SCIENCE
ASSOCIATION FOR HIGH ACHIEVEMENT IN POLITICAL SCIENCE



The Prize of the Foundation Mattei Dogan awarded by the International Political Science Association for High Achievement in Political Science is to honor a scholar of high international reputation in recognition of her/his contribution to the advancement of political science, with a particular focus on recognizing outstanding scholarship on comparative studies of political elites. The prize is awarded at every IPSA World Congress of Political Science.

The recipient for 2020 will be invited to present a prize lecture during the 26th IPSA World Congress of Political Science in Lisbon, and will receive an award with a value of US\$5,000 from the Foundation Mattei Dogan.

Nomination deadline: 1 November 2019

Prize: US\$3,000 and travel expenses (1 recipient)

The prize includes US\$3,000, travel expenses up to US\$2,000 and registration fee for the upcoming Congress. The award winner presents a lecture at the 2020 IPSA World Congress of Political Science. Funding: Foundation Mattei Dogan

Note: The prize is contingent upon attendance and lecture presentation at the 2020 World Congress.

GLOBAL SOUTH AWARD



Established to recognize the work done by a scholar from the Global South, and whose scholarly contribution is focused on the relevant countries/ regions/ themes. This award also recognizes cumulative body of work. It was awarded for the first time at the 2009 World Congress of Political Science.

The award recipient will be invited to present a prize lecture during the 2020 IPSA World Congress of Political Science and will receive \$1,000 US.

Amount: \$1,000 US (1 recipient)

The prize is of \$1,000 US for travel expenses for the IPSA World Congress for one winner. The cash prize is the total award; no further reimbursement is to be awarded to one winner. The award winner presents a lecture at the 2020 IPSA World Congress of Political Science in Lisbon.

Application deadline: 1 March 2020

Guidelines for application

The following are the criteria for the award:

- Recipients must originate from the Global South and deal with Global South issues
- Global South countries are considered as non-OECD countries. Applicants from OECD countries listed below are **not eligible** for the prize:

Applicants for the award are expected to submit:

- 1. a curriculum vitae,
- 2. a statement of the nature of the research project and an indication as to how it is of significance to the Global South;
- 3. a letter of reference from an academic familiar with the applicant's work certifying his or her academic status and indicating his or her suitability for the award;
- 4. a representative sample of written work whose length should not be greater than a scientific journal article

The IPSA Committee on Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA) will assess candidates' written work.

IPSA also invites related IPSA research committees to nominate candidates.

STEIN ROKKAN TRAVEL GRANT AWARD



The Stein Rokkan Award is one of the IPSA travel grants that the association began offering its members in the early 1990s. The purpose of the Stein Rokkan fellowships is to assist a small number of graduate students to attend the world congress by covering their basic travel and accommodation costs. The recipients receive financial assistance towards travel and subsistence. The awards are made on the recommendation of the IPSA Committee on Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA), and they are supported by the Stein Rokkan fund.

Stein Rokkan (1921-1979)

A promoter of social and political science, Stein Rokkan contributed greatly to the field of comparative politics, notably during his teaching years at Bergen University. He assumed the role of President of IPSA from 1970-73. He was also Vice-President of the International Sociological Association, Chairman of the European Consortium for Political Research (which he helped found), and President of the International Social Science Council.

Amount: US\$1,000 (1-2 recipients)

The prize is of US\$1,000 for basic travel and accommodation costs for the upcoming IPSA World Congress of Political Science. The monetary prize may be shared by two recipients. Note: The award recipient is to attend the IPSA Congress to receive the monetary prize.

Application deadline: 1 March 2019

Guidelines for application

The following are the criteria for the award:

- 1. each candidate must be registered in a degree granting programme;
- 2. normally candidates must be at the doctoral level but in exceptional cases where qualifications and money allow students at master's level may be considered;
- 3. candidates must demonstrate that their academic institutions and professors have bestowed on them high academic honour and esteem.

Applicants for the award are expected to submit:

- 1. a curriculum vitae,
- 2. a statement of the nature of the research project and an indication as to how it could benefit from participation in the Congress;
- 3. a letter of reference from an academic familiar with the applicant's work certifying his or her academic status and indicating his or her suitability for the award;
- 4. a representative sample of written work whose length should not be greater than a scientific journal article;
- 5. a statement indicating financial need in respect of the costs of attending the congress.

The IPSA Committee on Organization, Procedures and Awards (COPA) will assess candidates' written work.
